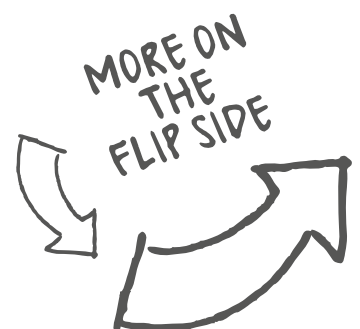

Australia offers an extensive range of English courses – so there's bound to be one that suits you:

Your goal	Courses available
To improve general proficiency to access higher level courses; to improve your English for travel; or to do casual work in an English speaking country	General English (GE): This focuses on informal and formal spoken English, and general communication skills.
You want to study in an Australian school, vocational college or university	Secondary/High School Preparation (S/HSP), English for Academic Purposes (EAP), English for Further Studies (EFS): These courses are generally based on the spoken and written English you'll need for further study.
You plan to take an exam such as IELTS, TOEFL, TOEIC, or the Cambridge First Certificate	Exam preparation course: A combination of general skills and knowledge development, as well as exam orientation and practice.
You want to learn the spoken and written English needed for a specific context	English for special purposes (ESP) courses, such as English for Business, English for Health Professionals, English for Hospitality: This study is usually based on the spoken and written English you will need for that particular context.
You want to teach English in schools in your own country	English for Teaching: These courses include TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages, EfTC (English for Teaching Children).
You want to have a short holiday and study English	Study tour: These courses are a combination of General English with sporting, social, tourist or cultural activities.

We're ready when you're ready.

You can choose to begin your English studies whenever it suits you. Most English language courses have flexible admission dates, starting anywhere from once a week to once a month.

Work on more than your English.

If you're coming to stay with us in Australia, chances are you'll want to do more than just study. And depending on the type of visa you choose, you'll have the flexibility to match your studies with up to 20 hours' work a week. Consider these options:

Student visa: Allows you to study full-time, work up to 20 hours per week, and travel.

Tourist visa: Allows you to study for up to 12 weeks while you travel.

Working holiday and Work & Holiday visas: Allows you to study for up to 17 weeks, work part-time or full-time and travel.

Investing in your future.

Tuition fees for English courses range from A\$12,000–\$19,000 per annum, with shorter courses available at considerably lower fees.

You can live comfortably as a student in Australia from A\$1,500–\$2,000 per month. And international students who hold student visas can help support these costs by working part-time.
